Upon consideration of the submission made on behalf of the parties, the Block Development Officer, Haripal Development Block, being the 7th respondent herein, is directed to consider and dispose of the representation dated October 12, 2022 within six weeks from the date of communication of this order upon granting reasonable opportunity of hearing to all concerned including the petitioner, in accordance with law.

The decision taken by the authority shall be communicated to the parties within a week thereof.

In the event the 7th respondent arrives at a decision in favour of the petitioner, necessary consequential steps be taken at the earliest.

The writ petition is disposed of.

There shall, however, be no order as to costs.

Since no affidavit is invited, the allegations contained in the writ petition are deemed not to have been admitted.
