An application for anticipatory bail under Section 482 of the Bharatiya Nagarik Suraksha Sanhita, 2023 in connection with Arambagh P.S. Case No.502 of 2025 dated 09.10.2025 under Sections 115(2)/3(5)/316(2)/318(2) of the BNS.

Leave is granted to amend the cause-title.

Heard learned counsels for the parties.

Perused the case diary.

It is the prosecution case that the de facto complainant had advanced a sum of money to the accused No.1, but the same has not been repaid. The accused No.1 further handed over the said amount to the present petitioner for investment purposes.

Considering the above, the other materials available in the case diary and the alleged role ascribed to the present petitioner, I am inclined to grant anticipatory bail to the petitioner.

In the event of arrest, the petitioner shall be released on bail upon furnishing a bond of Rs.10,000/- (rupees ten

thousand) with two sureties of like amount each, one of whom must be local, to the satisfaction of the Arresting Officer and also be subject to the conditions as laid down under Section 438(2) of the Code of Criminal Procedure, 1973 corresponding to Section 482(2) of the BNSS, 2023 and on the further conditions that the petitioner shall cooperate with the investigation, shall meet the investigating officer once a fortnight till submission of report in final form and shall not threaten or intimidate witnesses.

The application for anticipatory bail is, thus, allowed.
