CRM (NDPS) 1722 of 2025

In Re: An Application for Bail under Section 439 of the Code of Criminal Procedure, 1973/Under Section 483 of the Bharatiya Nagarik Suraksha Sanhita, 2023 in connection with Kumarganj Police Station case no. 107 of 2025 dated 18.03.2025 under Sections 21(c)/22(c)/23(c)/25/27A/28 of the of the Narcotic Drugs and Psychotropic Substances Act, 1985.

Learned advocate appearing for the petitioners submits that petitioner is in custody for more than 10 months and although charges have been framed but witness action has not commenced.

Learned advocate for the State opposes the prayer for bail.

I have taken into account the period of detention and that 15 witnesses are to be examined. Having considered that there is no possibility of the trial concluding very soon, I am inclined to release the petitioner on bail. Accordingly, the prayer for bail of the petitioner is **allowed**.

As such, petitioner namely, **Rantu Barman** shall be released on bail upon furnishing bond of Rs. 20,000/- (Rupees Twenty Thousand only), with two sureties of Rs. 10,000 (Rupees Ten Thousand only) each, one of whom must be local to the satisfaction of the learned Judge, Special Court under NDPS Act cum Additional

District and Sessions Judge, 3rd Court, Balurghat, Dakshin Dinajpur.

If on bail, the petitioner shall be physically present on each and every date before the learned trial Court in seisin of the case and shall not leave the jurisdiction of district of Dakshin Dinajpur without the prior permission of the learned Special Court.

Accordingly, the application for bail being CRM (NDPS) No. 1722 of 2025 is **allowed**.
