Learned advocate appearing for the petitioner submits that petitioner is in custody for 2 years and 6 months and only part examination of one witness has been done.

Learned advocate for the State submits that there are 7 victims in the instant case and 6 victims are yet to be examined.

Having considered the period of detention of the present petitioner, I direct the learned Trial Court to at least conclude the evidence of all the victims by 31.05.2026. At

this stage, I am not inclined to release the petitioner on bail as all the vulnerable witnesses are to be examined.

The petitioner will renew his prayer for bail after the evidence of these 6 child witnesses are over.

Learned Special Court would prioritize the evidence of these 6 victims and put in efforts so that by 30th May, 2026 the evidence of all the victims are over.

At this stage, CRM (M) 2921 of 2025 is **dismissed**.
