**CALCUTTA HIGH COURT
IN THE CIRCUIT BENCH AT JALPAIGURI**

Learned advocate for the petitioner submits that there has been change of circumstances, as, subsequently, statement under Section 164 of the Cr.P.,C./Section 183 of the BNSS has been recorded.

I find that, earlier, the present petitioner preferred an application for anticipatory bail. However, by a reasoned order, the Hon'ble Division Bench in CRM(A) 872 of 2024 was pleased to reject the prayer for anticipatory bail.

Subsequently, a revisional application being CRR 274 of 2025 was preferred.

Learned advocate for the State has produced the case diary as also the statement under Section 164 of the Cr.P.C./Section 183 of the BNSS.

I have perused and considered the same.

Having regard to the contents of the statement that no reasons have been assigned, for the interest of justice, I am not inclined to extend the privilege of anticipatory bail to the present petitioner.

Hence, the prayer for anticipatory bail of the petitioner is **rejected**.

However, if the petitioner appears before the learned Magistrate and/or the learned trial court *in seisin* of the case and prays for bail, the same be considered leniently.

Accordingly, CRM(A) 970 of 2025 is dismissed.
