PER COURT :

1. Heard the learned Counsel for the Petitioner as well as the learned Counsel for Respondent.
2. Both the Counsels submit that the matter is amicably settled between the Petitioner (wife) and the Respondent (husband). The parties have entered into compromise terms and conditions. An affidavit to that effect, bearing the signatures of the parties and their respective Counsels, is placed on record and marked 'X' for identification.
