1. The Court appreciates the efforts put in by the legal team of both the parties and also the parties themselves in resolving the issue raised in the present suit amicably.

2. The parties have tendered signed consent terms which are taken on record and marked "X" for identification. The parties are present in the chamber and after interacting with them, the parties have stated that they have understood the contents of the Consent Terms and they

have signed the Consent Terms without any undue influence or force.

3. The undertaking given in the Consent Terms are to be treated as undertaking given to the Court.
