This case came up for settlement before the National Lok Adalat. Both the parties are present. Ms.M.Malar, learned counsel for the appellants and Mr.D.Bhaskaran, learned counsel for 2nd respondent/Insurance Company are present. After mutual discussion, negotiation, mediation and conciliation between both parties, they arrived at a compromise to settle the matter as follows:

TERMS OF SETTLEMENT

The appellants have preferred this Civil Miscellaneous Appeal seeking to enhance the Award dated 16.08.2021 in M.A.C.T.O.P.No.2800 of 2019 passed by the learned Chief Judge, Court of Small Causes, Motor Accident Claims Tribunal, Chennai.

2. The Tribunal has passed an award of Rs.16,61,400/- with interest at the rate of 7.5% per annum from the date of petition till the date of deposit along with cost.

3. The parties are present along with their respective counsels. The appellants have preferred the present Civil Miscellaneous Appeal for enhancement of award amount of Rs.16,61,400/-.



4. After great deliberation and discussion, both the parties have agreed for enhancement of award amount with further additional sum of Rs.18,00,000/- in full quit (inclusive of interest).

5. In view of the compromise arrived at between the parties, the National Lok Adalat hereby declare and decree

that 2nd respondent/Insurance Company shall deposit the enhanced award amount of Rs.18,00,000/- (Rupees Eighteen Lakhs only) in full quit (inclusive of interest), within a period of six weeks from the date of receipt of a copy of this award. On such deposit, appellants are permitted to withdraw the enhanced award amount immediately, without filing any formal petition, before the competent Court. So far as the share of

minor appellants 2 & 2nd is concerned, the 2nd respondent/Insurance Company shall deposit the same in Fixed Deposit Account in any one of the Nationalized Banks, till they attain majority and the interest accrued thereon shall be withdrawn by their guardian once in three months, directly from the Bank.

6. It is made clear that out of the enhance award amount of Rs.18,00,000/-, appellants are entitled to their respective share as per the apportionment ordered by the Tribunal.

7. The Tribunal is directed to issue the cheques to the parties concerned on proper identification in accordance with



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the terms of the award, without insisting on any formal permission petition. The Civil Miscellaneous Appeal is disposed of accordingly.
