ORDER

The petitioners, who apprehend arrest at the hands of the respondent police for the offences punishable under Sections 191(2), 296(b), 115(2) and 351(2) of BNS, Act, 2023 in Crime No. 542 of 2025, on the file of the



respondent Police, seek anticipatory bail.

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2. The allegation against the petitioners is that there was some property dispute between the petitioners and the de-facto complainant and subsequently, the petitioners assaulted the de-facto complainant and his family members, resulting in, the de-facto complainant severely injured. Hence the case.

3. The learned counsel for the petitioners submits that the petitioners have not committed any offences as alleged by the prosecution and they have been falsely implicated in this case. He also submits that this case is a counter case in Crime No. 541 of 2025 has been registered against the de-facto complainant. He further submits that they are ready to abide by any conditions that may be imposed by this Court and ready to furnish sufficient solvent sureties for their release. Hence, he prays for grant of anticipatory bail to the petitioners.

4. The learned Government Advocate (Criminal side) for the respondent police, reiterated the prosecution case and submits that the injured is discharged from the hospital and the petitioners have no previous



case. He further submits that this case is a counter case in Crime No. 541 of 2025 has been registered against the de-facto complainant. He opposed to grant anticipatory bail to the petitioners.

5. Heard the learned counsels and perused the materials available on record.

6. Considering the nature of offences, and there was money transactions between the petitioners; that the injured is discharged from the hospital; and also considering the fact that the petitioners have no previous case, this Court is inclined to grant anticipatory bail to the petitioners with certain conditions.

7. Accordingly, the petitioners are ordered to be released on bail in the event of arrest or on their appearance, within a period of fifteen days from the date on which the order copy made ready, before the learned **Judicial Magistrate Court, Uthangarai**, on condition that the petitioners shall execute a bond for a sum of **Rs.20,000/- (Rupees Twenty Thousand Only) with two sureties** each for a like sum to the satisfaction of the learned Magistrate concerned and on further condition that:



(a) If the petitioners fail to surrender before the concerned Magistrate, within a period of fifteen days from the date of receipt of a copy of this order, this order shall stand automatically cancelled;

[b] the sureties shall affix their photographs and Left Thumb Impression in the Application for Surety ship [Judicial Form No.46 annexed to 'The Criminal Rules of Practice, 2019']. The learned Magistrate shall obtain a copy of any one of the identity proofs to ensure their identity;

[c] the petitioners shall report before the respondent Police daily at 10.30 a.m for a period of four weeks and thereafter, as and when required for interrogation;

[d] On breach of any of the aforementioned conditions, the learned Magistrate/Trial Court is entitled to pass appropriate orders against the petitioner in accordance with law as if the aforementioned conditions have been imposed and the petitioner released on bail by the learned Magistrate/Trial Court himself as laid down by the Hon'ble Supreme Court in **P.K.Shaji vs. State of Kerala [(2005)13 SCC 283]**;



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[e] If the accused thereafter absconds, a fresh FIR
can be registered under Section 269 of B.N.S.
