ORDER

The petitioner, who was arrested and remanded to judicial custody on 10.12.2025 for the offences punishable under Sections 103(2) and 126(2) of BNS 2023 @ 103(1) and 126(2) of BNS, 2023 in Crime No.249 of 2025, registered on the file of the respondent police, seeks bail.



2. The allegation against the petitioner is that he is the son of A1 in this case and that there were frequent quarrel entered between the deceased and A1 & A2. It is alleged that, one day prior to the occurrence, A1 and A2 attacked and assaulted the deceased. It is further alleged that, on the next day morning, after another quarrel, A1 waylaid the deceased and repeatedly stabbed him with a knife, causing serious injuries, to which the deceased subsequently succumbed. Hence, a case has been registered and the petitioner was arrested.

3. The learned counsel appearing for the petitioner submitted that the petitioner is ranked as A2 and that he is in judicial custody since 10.12.2025. He further submitted that the petitioner is working at CMC hospital and that he did not participate in the alleged occurrence at the time of the incident. Hence, he prays to grant bail to the petitioner.

4. The learned Government Advocate (Crl. Side) reiterated the prosecution case and submitted that the petitioner is an instigator and that he was also present along with A1 in the previous occurrence and that the petitioner was arrested and the investigation is still pending. Hence, he opposed to grant bail to the petitioner.

4. Heard both sides and perused the materials available on record.

5. Considering the submissions made by the learned counsel on either side, the nature of the allegations, the specific overt act attributed against the petitioner/A1 and also considering the period of incarceration, this Court is



inclined to grant bail with certain conditions.

6. Accordingly, the petitioner is ordered to be released on bail on his executing a bond for a sum of **Rs.25,000/- (Rupees Twenty Five Thousand only)** with two sureties each, for a like sum to the satisfaction of the learned **Judicial Magistrate No.I, Vellore, Vellore District**, and on further conditions that:

[a] the sureties shall affix their photographs and Left Thumb Impression in the surety bond and the Magistrate may obtain a copy of their Aadhar card or Bank pass Book to ensure their identity;

[b] the petitioner shall report before the respondent police daily at 10.30 a.m., for a period of three weeks and thereafter as and when required for interrogation.

[c] the petitioner shall not abscond either during investigation or trial;

[d] the petitioner shall not tamper with the evidence or witness either during investigation or trial;

[e] On breach of any of the aforesaid conditions, the learned Magistrate/Trial Court is entitled to take appropriate action against the petitioner in accordance with law as if the conditions have been imposed and the petitioner released on bail by the learned



Magistrate/Trial Court himself, as laid down by the Hon'ble
Supreme Court in P.K.Shaji vs. State of Kerala [(2005)AIR SCW
5560];

[f] If the accused thereafter absconds, a fresh FIR can be
registered under Section 269 B.N.S.
