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ORDER

The petitioner herein apprehends arrest at the hands of the respondent police for the offences punishable under Sections 281, 125, 292, 49 of BNS, 2023 and Section 189 of Motor Vehicles Act, 1988 @ 281, 125, 292, 110, 49, 110 of BNS, 2023 and 189 of Motor Vehicles Act, 1988 in Crime No.46 of 2026, on the file of the respondent Police, seeks anticipatory bail.

2. The allegation against the petitioner is that the petitioner joining hands with 13 other accused involved in conducting auto race in the busy city road at Koyambedu, which resulted in causing disturbance to the other commuters. It is further alleged that, it was videographed and uploaded in the social media and hence the case was registered.

3. The learned counsel appearing for the petitioner submitted that based on the social media viral, the case was registered. He further submitted that the co-accused was arrested and released on bail and the petitioner has no previous case. Hence, he prayed for grant of anticipatory bail to the petitioner.



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4. The learned Government Advocate (Crl.Side) appearing for the respondent police reiterated the prosecution case and submitted that the petitioner has no previous case. However, he opposed for grant of bail to the petitioner.

5. I have gone through the FIR and other connected records.

6. It is seen that the petitioner has involved in rash and negligent driving in the busy city road causing havoc on the commuters, however considering the fact that no one is injured and also the fact that the co-accused had been arrested and released on bail, this Court is inclined to grant anticipatory bail to the petitioner with certain conditions:

7. Accordingly, the petitioner is ordered to be released on bail in the event of arrest or on their appearance, within a period of ten days from the date of receipt of a copy of this order, before the learned **Judicial Magistrate No.I, Poonamallee**, on condition that the petitioner shall execute a bond for a sum of **Rs.20,000/- (Rupees Twenty Thousand Only)** with two sureties each for a like sum to the satisfaction of the learned Magistrate concerned, and on further condition that:



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[a] if the petitioner fails to surrender before the concerned Magistrate within a period of ten days from the date of receipt of a copy of this order, this order shall stand automatically cancelled;

[b] the sureties shall affix their photographs and Left Thumb Impression in the Application for Surety ship [Judicial Form No.46 annexed to 'The Criminal Rules of Practice, 2019']. The learned Magistrate shall obtain a copy of any one of the identity proofs to ensure their identity;

[c] the petitioner shall report before the respondent police daily at 10.30.a.m., for a period of two weeks and thereafter as and when required for interrogation;

[d] On breach of any of the aforementioned conditions, the learned Magistrate/Trial Court is entitled to pass appropriate orders against the petitioner in accordance with law as if the aforementioned conditions have been imposed and the petitioner released on bail by the learned Magistrate/Trial Court himself as laid down by the Hon'ble Supreme Court in **P.K.Shaji vs. State of Kerala [(2005)13 SCC 283]**;



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[e] If the accused thereafter absconds, a fresh FIR
can be registered under Section 269 of B.N.S.
