COMMON ORDER

The Writ Petitions have been filed to direct the respondents to pay interest amounts to the Petitioner for the belatedly paid Service Gratuity, Provident Fund, Leave Salary and commutation of pension at the rate of 6 percent per annum for 16 months of delayed payment in the light of the judgment passed by this Honble Court on 23.10.2024 in W.P.No.30766 of 2024.

2. It is the case of the petitioners that the petitioners, who had joined the services of the respondent Corporation, had retired from service, however, the terminal benefits have been settled belatedly. Therefore, the petitioners claimed 12% interest on the belated payment of terminal benefits and they have also made representations to pay interest for the belated payment of terminal benefits which has not been evoked any response so far. Hence, the petitioners are before this Court.

3. Heard the learned counsels appearing on either side and perused the materials available on record.

4. In view of the limited request made by the petitioners with regard to interest on the belated payment of terminal benefits, this Court directs the respondent to pay interest @ 6% for the belated payment of terminal benefits from the date of retirement till the date of actual disbursement of terminal benefits



of the petitioners, within a period of six weeks from the date of receipt of a copy of this order taking into account the bank rate of interest on deposits.

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5. Accordingly, the Writ Petitions are disposed of. There shall be no order as to costs.
