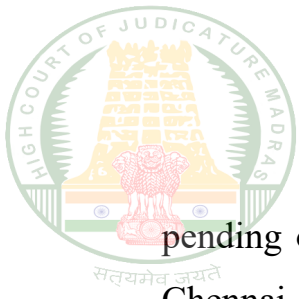

The petitioner/accused has filed this Criminal Original Petition seeking to call for the records in the FIR in Crime No.231 of 2025 pending on the file of the respondent Police and to quash the same.

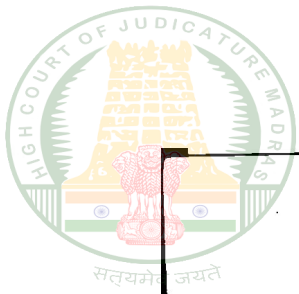
2.The petitioners herein are arrayed as Accused Nos. 1 to 3 in the above FIR registered based on the complaint given by the 2nd respondent /defacto complainant alleging that on 08.06.2025 at about 11 pm, near SBI ATM, Royapettah, the petitioners were restrained the 2nd respondent and abused him in



filthy language, and taken away his mobile phone. The petitioners were arrested on 13.06.2025 by the respondent police and the petitioners/ A2 and 3 were enlarged on bail on 17.06.2025 and the petitioner /A-1 was enlarged on bail on 19.06.2025 respectively.

3. It is submitted by the learned counsel for the petitioner that the complaint arose out of a sudden misunderstanding and trivial altercation between the petitioners and the defacto complainant and has now been amicably settled between the parties. The learned counsel for the petitioners and the learned counsel appearing for the 2nd respondent would submit that the dispute between the parties has been amicably settled A Joint Memo of Compromise, duly signed by the petitioner and the defacto complainant, has been filed before this Court. The parties are also present in person and have been identified by their respective counsel.

4. The learned counsel appearing for the defacto complainant would submit that in view of the settlement arrived at between the parties, the defacto complainant has no objection for quashing the FIR. The scanned copy of the joint compromise memo dated 10.04.2026 is as hereunder:

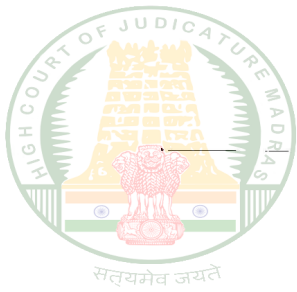

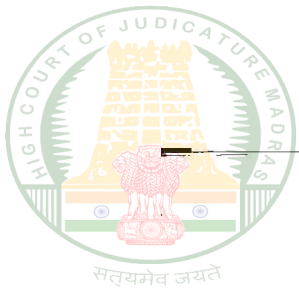
JOINT MEMO OF COMPROMISE

The Petitioners/Accused 1 to 3 and the 2nd Respondent/Defacto Complainant
respectfully submit as follows: -

1. The Petitioners herein are the Accused Nos. 1 to 3 in FIR No. 231 of 2025 on the file of the Inspector of Police, Annasalai Police Station, Chennai, registered for the alleged offences under Sections 126(2), 296(b), 115(2), 309(4) and 351(2) of the Bharatiya Nyaya Sanhita, 2023.
2. The 2nd Respondent herein is the Defacto Complainant who had lodged the complaint, based on which the above FIR came to be registered alleging that on 08.06.2025 at about 11.00 p.m., near SBI ATM, Royapettah, the Petitioners herein had allegedly restrained him, abused him, caused hurt and taken away his mobile phone.

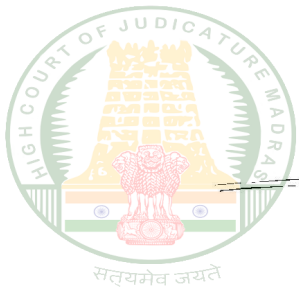
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3. The Petitioners submit that the said complaint arose out of a misunderstanding and a wordy altercation between the parties and the same was not intentional.
4. It is submitted that subsequently, with the intervention of elders, well-wishers and respectable persons, the parties have amicably settled all their disputes and differences.
5. The 2nd Respondent/Defacto Complainant submits that he has no grievance whatsoever against the Petitioners and that he has also received his belongings and there are no claims pending between the parties.
6. The parties hereby jointly submit that the dispute is purely personal in nature and does not affect any public interest or public peace.
7. The 2nd Respondent/Defacto Complainant has no objection whatsoever for quashing the FIR in Crime No. 231 of 2025 on the file of the Inspector of Police, Annasalai Police Station, Chennai.
8. Both parties submit that the above compromise has been arrived at out of their own free will, volition and consent and without any coercion, undue influence or compulsion from any end.
9. The parties further submit that in view of the amicable settlement, continuation of the criminal proceedings would be an exercise in futility and would only result in unnecessary hardship to both sides.

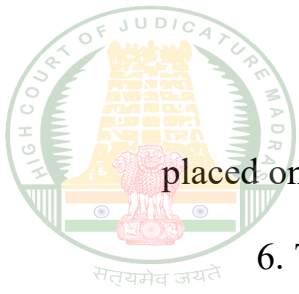

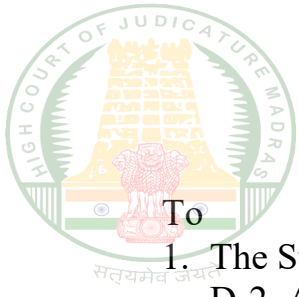
