ORDER

The petitioners apprehend arrest for the alleged offences under Sections 241, 324 (4), 61 (2), 331 (3) and 351 (2) of BNS in Crime No.73 of 2026 on the file of the respondent police seek anticipatory bail.

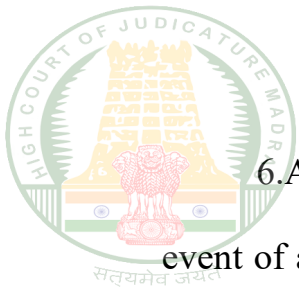


2. The case of the prosecution is that the defacto-complainant was maintaining the property situated at Paradarami Main Road, Gudiyatham Taluk, Vellore District. However, the petitioners trespassed into the defacto-complainant's house and caused damage. Hence, the case.

3. The learned counsel appearing for the petitioners submitted that the petitioners are innocent and had been falsely implicated in this case. He further states that the alleged occurrence took place on 09.04.2026, and the First Information Report came to be registered on 11.04.2026. Hence, he prays to grant anticipatory bail to the petitioners.

4. The learned Government Advocate (Criminal Side) appearing for the respondent police reiterated the prosecution case and submitted that no one has been injured. However, he opposed the grant of anticipatory bail to the petitioners.

5. Considering the facts that the first, third, fifth and sixth petitioners are women, that the occurrence took place on 09.04.2026 that no one was injured, and that the First Information Report was registered on 11.04.2026, this Court is of the firm view that the custodial interrogation of the petitioners is not necessary. Hence, this Court is inclined to grant anticipatory bail to the petitioners, subject to certain conditions.



6. Accordingly, the petitioners are ordered to be released on bail in the event of arrest or on their appearance, within a period of fifteen (15) days from the date on which the order copy is made ready, before the **learned Judicial Magistrate, Kudiyatham**, on condition that **the petitioners shall execute a bond for a sum of Rs.25,000/- (Rupees Twenty Five Thousand only) each, with two sureties each**, for a like sum to the satisfaction of the learned Magistrate concerned, and on further conditions:

(a) If the petitioners fails to surrender before the concerned learned Magistrate within a period of fifteen (15) days from the date of receipt of a copy of this order, this order shall stand automatically cancelled;

(b) The sureties shall affix their photographs and left thumb impression in the application for surety ship (Judicial Form No.46 annexed to 'The Criminal Rules of Practice, 2019]'. The learned Magistrate shall obtain a copy of any one of identify proofs to ensure their identity;

(c) The petitioners shall report before the respondent police as and when required for interrogation;

(d) On breach of any of the aforesaid conditions, the learned Magistrate/Trial Court is entitled to take appropriate actions against the petitioners in accordance with law as if the conditions have been imposed and the petitioners released on anticipatory bail by the learned Magistrate/Trial Court himself as laid down by the Hon'ble Supreme Court in ***P.K.Shaji v. State of Kerala [(2005) AIR SCW 5560]***;
