ORDER

The petitioner who apprehends arrest in the hands of the respondent police for the offences punishable under Sections 191(2), 191(3), 329(2), 296(b), 324(4), 351(3) of BNS & Section 4 of TNPHW Act in connection with the Cr. No.75 of 2026, seeks anticipatory bail.



2. The case of the prosecution is that there was some property dispute between the petitioner and the defacto complainant, due to which the petitioner abused and assaulted the defacto complainant, as a result of which the petitioner sustained injuries. Hence the case.

3. Learned counsel appearing for the petitioner submitted that the petitioner is a innocent and he has not committed any such offence as alleged by the prosecution. He further submitted that the petitioner is ready to abide by any other stringent condition that may be imposed by this Court. Hence, he prayed anticipatory bail for the petitioner.

4. The learned Government Advocate (Criminal Side) appearing for the respondent police reiterated the prosecution case and submitted that Petitioner is having no previous cases. He further submitted that the injured has been discharged from the Hospital. However, he vehemently opposed to grant anticipatory bail to the Petitioner.

5. Heard both sides and perused the materials available on record.

6. Considering the rival submissions on either side, considering the fact that the injured has been discharged from the hospital and there is no



previous cases pending against the petitioner, I am inclined to grant anticipatory bail to the petitioner subject to the following conditions.

7. Accordingly, the petitioner is ordered to be released on bail in the event of arrest or on his appearance, within a period of fifteen days from the date on which the order copy made ready, before the **learned X Metropolitan Magistrate Court, Egmore, Chennai 600 008** on condition that the petitioner shall execute a bond for a sum of Rs.10,000/- (Rupees Ten Thousand only) with two sureties each for a like sum to the satisfaction of the learned Magistrate concerned and on further condition that:

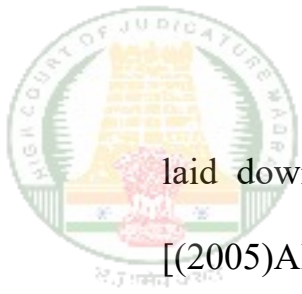
[a] the petitioner shall report before the respondent police on every saturday at 10.00 a.m for a period of four weeks and thereafter as and when required for interrogation.

[b] the petitioner shall not, directly or indirectly, make any inducement, threat or promise to any person acquainted with the facts of the case so as to dissuade her from disclosing such facts to the Court or to any police officer;

[c] the petitioner shall not leave India without the previous permission of the Court;

[d] the petitioner shall not abscond either during investigation or trial.

[e] On breach of any of the aforesaid conditions, the learned Magistrate/Trial Court is entitled to take appropriate action against the petitioner in accordance with law as if the conditions have been imposed and the petitioner released on bail by the learned Magistrate/Trial Court himself as



laid down by the Hon'ble Supreme Court in P.K.Shaji vs. State of Kerala [(2005)AIR SCW 5560].
