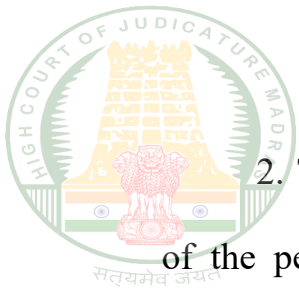

ORDER

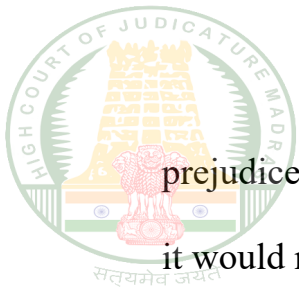
The petitioner, who apprehends arrest at the hands of the respondent Police for the offences punishable under Sections 303(2) and 326(a) of BNS, 2023 in Crime No.360 of 2025 on the file of the respondent Police, seeks anticipatory bail.



2. The learned counsel for the petitioner, pleading innocence on the part of the petitioner and false implication in the case, seeks indulgence of this Court. He submits that the petitioner, without prejudice to the defence and contention, is ready and willing to deposit a sum of Rs.25,000/- to any welfare scheme of the Government or any other organization. He would further submit that the petitioner is ready to abide by any stringent condition that may be imposed by this Court. Therefore he prayed to grant anticipatory bail to the petitioner.

3. The case of the prosecution as put forth by the learned Government Advocate (Criminal Side) appearing for the respondent police, opposing for grant of anticipatory bail, is that on 05.11.2025 at about 11.45 a.m. the petitioner along with other accused have smuggled three units of M-Sand using a Tipper Lorry bearing Registration No.TN 83H 0571 without any valid permission. He further submitted that the petitioner is arrayed as A1 and he is the owner of the aforesaid vehicle. He further submitted that the petitioner has one previous case of similar in nature.

4. Considering the voluntary submission made by the learned counsel for the petitioner, the petitioner is directed to deposit a sum of **Rs.25,000/- (Rupees Twenty Five Thousand only)** to the credit of **Adyar Cancer Institute (Union Bank of India, Name: Cancer Institute (WIA), Account No: 149710011005477, IFSC Code: UBIN0814971), Chennai**, without



prejudice to the right of defence before the Trial Court and making it clear that it would not amount to admission of guilt.

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5. Having heard the learned counsel for the petitioner, the learned Government Advocate (Crl.Side) for the respondent Police and perused the materials available on record and considering that the petitioner has one previous case, this Court is inclined to grant anticipatory bail to the petitioner with certain conditions. Accordingly, the petitioner is ordered to be released on bail in the event of arrest or on his appearance, within a period of fifteen days from the date on which the order copy made ready, before the learned Judicial Magistrate No.I, Tirupattur on condition that the petitioner shall execute a bond for a sum of **Rs.15,000/- (Rupees Fifteen Thousand only)** with **two sureties** each for a like sum to the satisfaction of the learned Magistrate concerned, failing which, the petition for anticipatory bail shall stand dismissed and on further condition that:

[a] the petitioner and the sureties shall affix their photographs and Left Thumb Impression in the surety bond and the Magistrate may obtain a copy of their Aadhar card or Bank pass Book to ensure their identity;

[b] the petitioner shall report before the respondent Police, daily at 10.30 a.m., until further orders;

[c] the petitioner shall not tamper with evidence or witness either during investigation or trial;

[d] the petitioner shall not abscond either during



investigation or trial;

[e] On breach of any of the aforesaid conditions, the learned Magistrate/Trial Court is entitled to take appropriate action against the petitioner in accordance with law as if the conditions have been imposed and the petitioner released on bail by the learned Magistrate/Trial Court himself as laid down by the Hon'ble Supreme Court in P.K.Shaji vs. State of Kerala [(2005)AIR SCW 5560];

[f] If the accused thereafter absconds, a fresh FIR can be registered under Section 269 of B.N.S.

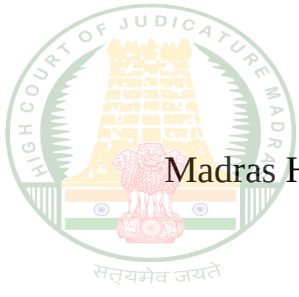
