Prayer: Petition filed under Article 226 of the Constitution of India, praying for issuance of a Writ of Mandamus, directing the respondents to regularize the petitioner's services and fix a regular pay with effect from 2019 and to pay all the service benefits and all other attained benefits to the petitioner within a time frame fixed by this Court.

ORDER

This Writ Petition has been filed seeking a direction to the respondents to regularize the petitioner's services and fix a regular pay with effect from 2019 and to pay all the service and all other attained benefits to the petitioner, within a time frame as fixed by this Court.

2. Heard the learned counsels on either side. With the consent of both sides, the Writ Petition is taken up for hearing at the admission stage itself.

3. The learned counsel for the petitioner submitted that the petitioner was appointed as RCH Worker by the respondents on 18.02.20219 and was paid a sum of Rs.1500/- as consolidated pay till now even after rendering service for more than 5 years. He contented that the respondents have not followed the Government Orders to pay minimum wages to the petitioner and also submitted that the action of the respondents amounts to violation under Article 23 of the Constitution of India. Hence, the learned counsel prayed to grant the relief as sought for by the petitioner in this Writ Petition.



4. Considering the facts and circumstances of the case and the contentions put forth by the learned counsel for the petitioner, this Court directs the petitioner to submit a representation to the respondents ventilating all his grievances, within a period of two weeks from the date of receipt of a copy of this order and on receipt of the same, the respondent concerned shall consider and dispose of the same on merits and in accordance with law, within a period of six weeks therefrom.

5. With the above directions, the Writ Petition stands disposed of. Consequently, connected Miscellaneous Petition is closed. There shall be no orders as to costs.
