PRAYER :- For Anticipatory Bail in Cr.No. 8 of 2026 on the file of the respondent police.

ORDER

The petitioners, who apprehend arrest at the hands of the respondent police for the offences punishable under Sections 296(b), 115(2), 118(1),



351(3) of BNS ACT, 2023 and Section 4 of the Tamil Nadu Prohibition of Harassment of Women Act, 1998, seeks anticipatory bail.

2. The case of the prosecution is that due to wordy quarrel between the defacto complainant and the petitioners, the accused persons have abused the defacto complainant and attacked with a deadly weapon and caused injuries and the petitioners have also attacked the defacto complainant's father. Hence, a case has been registered as against the petitioner.

3. The learned Counsel appearing for the petitioners submitted that the petitioners have been falsely implicated in this case and they have not committed any offence. He seeks this Court to grant anticipatory bail to the petitioners.

4. The learned Government Advocate (Crl. side) appearing for the respondent submitted that there is no previous case pending against the petitioners and the injured discharged from the hospital.

5. Considering the facts and circumstances of the case and also considering the fact that there is no previous case pending against the



petitioners and the injured also discharged from the hospital, this Court is inclined to grant anticipatory bail to the petitioner with certain conditions.

6. Accordingly, the petitioners are ordered to be released on bail in the event of arrest or on his appearance, on condition that the petitioner shall execute a bond for a sum of Rs.10,000/-(Rupees Ten Thousand only) with two sureties each for a like sum to the satisfaction of The Judicial Magistrate Court-II, Madurai, within a period of fifteen days from the date when the order copy made ready and on further conditions that:

[a] the petitioners and the sureties shall affix their photographs and left thumb impression in the surety bond and the Magistrate may obtain a copy of their Aadhaar card or bank pass book to ensure their identity.

[b]the 1st petitioner shall stay at Virudhunagar and report before the Virudhunagar Town P.S., daily at 10.30 a.m., for a period of two weeks and thereafter appear before the respondent police as and when required for interrogation and the 2 to 4 petitioners shall cooperate with the interrogation.

[c]the petitioners shall not tamper with the evidence or witness either during investigation or trial.

[d]the petitioners shall not abscond either during investigation or trial.



[e]On breach of any of the aforesaid conditions, the learned Magistrate/Trial Court is entitled to take appropriate action against the petitioner in accordance with law as if the conditions have been imposed and the petitioner is released on bail by the learned Magistrate/Trial Court himself as laid down by the Hon'ble Supreme Court in P.K.Shaji vs. State of Kerala [(2005)AIR SCW 5560].

[f]If the accused thereafter absconds, a fresh FIR can be registered under Section 269 of BNS.
