2. Heard the learned counsel for the petitioner, learned Additional Government Pleader and the learned Government Advocate for the official respondents.

3. The petitioner's case is that the branches of the coconut trees belonging to the 6th respondent are entering into the petitioner's household through the windows thereby obstructing the free flow of air and screening the sunlight. Therefore, the petitioner preferred a representation dated 26.02.2024 to the first respondent to take against the 6th respondent under Section 133 of the Code of Criminal Procedure for the nuisance caused. However, the said representation is pending so far without any action and hence, the petitioner is before this Court.

4. The learned Additional Government Pleader, on instructions from the officials present in the Court, would submit that on considering the representation of the petitioner, the branches have been removed by the officials. The said submission is recorded.
