PETITION FOR BAIL Under Sec.483 of BNSS

PRAYER :-

For Bail in Cr.No. 252 of 2025 on the file of the respondent police.

ORDER : The Court made the following order :-

The petitioner / Accused, who was arrested and remanded to judicial custody on 25.11.2025, for the offences punishable under Sections 8(c) r/w. 20(b)(ii)(c), 29(1) of NDPS Act, in Crime No.252 of 2025 on the file of the



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respondent police, seeks bail.

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2. The case of the prosecution is that on 25.11.2025 at 06.00 a.m., on secret information the respondent police went to the scene of occurrence and found the petitioner along with other accused in possession of 23 Kilograms of Ganja in the house of one Muthumani. Hence, the case.

3. The learned counsel appearing for the petitioner would submit that the petitioner is innocent and he was falsely implicated in this case and he has not committed any offence as alleged by the prosecution. There is no direct recovery from this petitioner. Co-accused has been released on bail. Hence, he prayed bail for the petitioner.

4. The learned Additional Public Prosecutor appearing for the respondent would submit that the offence are grave in nature. The contraband recovered in this case is commercial quantity. The petitioner along with other accused carrying the 51 kgs. of Ganja in gunny bags. So far as this petitioner is concerned he is carrying 23 kgs. of Ganja. Investigation is still pending. Hence, he vehemently opposed the grant of bail to the petitioner. The petitioner has three previous cases.



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5. This Court heard both sides and perused the materials available on record.

6. Considering the rival submissions made by the learned counsel on either side, considering the nature of charges levelled against the petitioner, this petitioner was arrayed as accused only based on the confession statement of the co-accused, there is no recovery from the this petitioner, as per the FIR recovery is from one Muthumani, co-accused was released on bail, no previous case of similar kind of offence against the petitioner, though the petitioner has three previous cases under IPC, in all those cases, already he was granted bail, and considering the period of incarceration undergone by the petitioner, this Court is inclined to grant bail to the petitioner subject to the following conditions:

[a] Accordingly, the petitioner is ordered to be released on bail on condition to execute a bond for a sum of Rs.10,000/- (Rupees Ten Thousand only) with two sureties each for a like sum to the satisfaction of the learned District and Sessions Judge/Presiding Officer, Special Court for E.C. and NDPS Court Cases, Madurai, and on further conditions that:



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[b] the petitioner shall report before the respondent police, daily at 10.30 a.m., until further orders;

[c] the petitioner shall not commit any offence similar to the offence of which he/she is accused, or suspected, or of the commission of which he/she is suspected;

[d] the petitioner shall not abscond either during investigation or trial;

[e] the petitioner shall not directly or indirectly make any inducement, threat or promise to any person acquainted with the facts of the case so as to dissuade her from disclosing such facts to the Court or to any police officer or tamper with the evidence;

[f] On breach of any of the aforesaid conditions, the learned Judicial Magistrate/Trial Court is entitled to take appropriate action against the petitioner in accordance with law as if the conditions have been imposed and the petitioner released on bail by the learned Magistrate/Trial Court himself as laid down by the Hon'ble Supreme Court in P.K.Shaji vs. State of Kerala [(2005)AIR SCW 5560].

[g] If the accused thereafter absconds, a fresh FIR can be registered under Section 269 BNS.
