PETITION FOR BAIL Under Sec.483 of BNSS

PRAYER :-

For Bail in Cr.No.110 of 2026 on the file of the respondent police.



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ORDER : The Court made the following order :-

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The petitioners / Accused, who were arrested and remanded to judicial custody on 03.06.2026 for the offences punishable under Section 25(1A) of Arms Act in Crime No. 110 of 2026 on the file of the respondent police, seek bail.

2. The case of the prosecution is that on 03.06.2026 at about 02.00p.m., the respondent were doing their regular patrol duty and found that the accused persons had unlawful possession of aruval in order to commit crimes and to threaten the public. Hence the case.

3. The learned counsel appearing for the petitioner would submit that the petitioner is innocent and they were falsely implicated in this case and they have not committed any offence as alleged by the prosecution. He would further submit that the petitioners have been arrested and remanded to judicial custody on 03.06.2026. Therefore, prayed to grant bail for the petitioners.



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4. The learned Government Advocate (Crl.Side) appearing

for the respondent would submit that based on the complaint lodged by the defacto complainant, who is a police official, the case has been registered against the accused persons. The petitioners have previous cases. He would further submit that the investigation is pending and the offences are grave in nature and hence, he strongly opposed to grant bail to the petitioners.

5. This Court heard both sides and perused the materials available on record.

6. Considering the rival submissions made by the learned counsel on either side, the nature of the offence and the fact that nobody injured in this case and further considering the fact that the alleged complaint was not lodged by any public and also the fact that though the petitioners have previous cases to their credit, they have already been granted bail in those cases, as well as taking into account of the period of incarceration undergone by the petitioners, this Court is inclined to grant bail to the petitioners subject to the following conditions:



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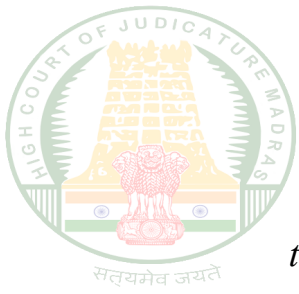
*[a] Accordingly, this Criminal Original Petition is allowed and the petitioners are ordered to be released on bail on condition to execute a bond for a sum of Rs.10,000/- (Rupees Ten Thousand only) each with two sureties each for a like sum to the satisfaction of the **learned Judicial Magistrate No.I, Virudhunagar**, and on further conditions that:*

*[b] the petitioners shall report before the **Inspector of Police, Vachakarapatti Police Station** daily at 10.30 a.m., for a period of thirty days, thereafter, as and when required for interrogation before the respondent;*

[c] the petitioners shall not commit any offence similar to the offence of which they are accused, or suspected, or of the commission of which they are suspected;

[d] the petitioners shall not abscond either during investigation or trial;

[e] the petitioners shall not directly or indirectly make any inducement, threat or promise to any person acquainted with the facts of the case so as to dissuade her from disclosing such facts to the Court or to any police officer or tamper with



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the evidence;

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[f] On breach of any of the aforesaid conditions, the learned Judicial Magistrate/Trial Court is entitled to take appropriate action against the petitioners in accordance with law as if the conditions have been imposed and the petitioners released on bail by the learned Magistrate/Trial Court himself as laid down by the Hon'ble Supreme Court in P.K.Shaji vs. State of Kerala [(2005)AIR SCW 5560].

[g] If the accused thereafter absconds, a fresh FIR can be registered under Section 269 BNS.
