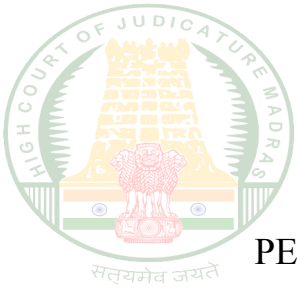

PETITION FOR BAIL Under Sec.483 of BNSS

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PRAYER :-

C-8B. For Bail in Cr.No.77 of 2026 on the file of the respondent police.

ORDER : The Court made the following order :-

The petitioner/Sole accused, who was arrested and remanded to judicial custody on 02.05.2026 for the offences punishable under Sections 109, 118(1), 296(b) and 351(3) of BNS, 2023, in Crime No.77 of 2026 on the file of the respondent police, seeks bail.

2.The allegation against the petitioner is that the petitioner has attempted to commit murder of the defacto complainant and caused injuries on the hands. Hence, the case.

3.The learned counsel for the petitioner would submit that the petitioner is an innocent, he was falsely implicated in this case, he is no way connected in the above said incident and he is ready to cooperate with investigation. He would further submit that though the petitioner is having seven previous cases, the petitioner has been falsely implicated in



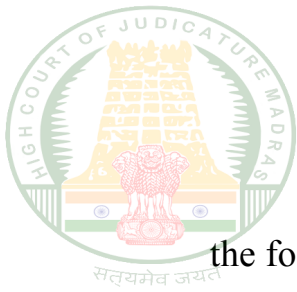

those cases. The petitioner has been arrested and remanded to judicial custody on 02.05.2026. Hence, he prays to grant bail to the petitioner.

4. The learned counsel for State of TN (Crl. Side) appearing for the respondent would submit that the petitioner is having seven previous cases and the injured has been discharged from the hospital. He would further submit that the investigation is still pending and the offences are grave in nature. Hence, he strongly opposed to grant bail to the petitioner.

5. This Court heard both sides and perused the materials available on record.

6. Considering the rival submissions made by the learned counsel on either side and the nature of offences levelled against the petitioner and though the petitioner is having seven previous cases, majority cases were disposed of and injured has been discharged from the hospital and also considering the period of incarceration undergone by the petitioner from 02.05.2026, I am inclined to grant bail to the petitioner subject to

the following conditions:

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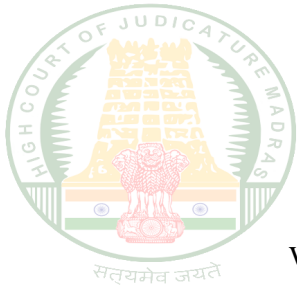
[a] Accordingly, this petition is ordered and the petitioner is ordered to be released on bail on condition to execute a bond for a sum of Rs.15,000/- (Rupees Fifteen Thousand only) with two sureties each for a like sum to the satisfaction of the **learned Judicial Magistrate No.II, Sivakasi**, and on further conditions that:

[b] the petitioner shall report before the learned Judicial Magistrate No.II, Sivakasi, on all working days at 10.30 a.m., for a period of three weeks and thereafter, as and when required for interrogation.

[c] the petitioner shall not commit any offence similar to the offence of which she is accused, or suspected, or of the commission of which she is suspected;

[d] the petitioner shall not abscond either during investigation or trial;

[e] the petitioner shall not directly or indirectly make any inducement, threat or promise to any person acquainted

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with the facts of the case so as to dissuade her from disclosing such facts to the Court or to any police officer or tamper with the evidence;

[f] On breach of any of the aforesaid conditions, the learned Judicial Magistrate/Trial Court is entitled to take appropriate action against the petitioner in accordance with law as if the conditions have been imposed and the petitioner released on bail by the learned Magistrate/Trial Court himself as laid down by the Hon'ble Supreme Court in P.K.Shaji vs. State of Kerala [(2005)AIR SCW 5560].

[g] If the accused thereafter absconds, a fresh FIR can be registered under Section 269 BNS.
