H2-GO.To call for the entire records connected with the detention order of the Respondent No.2 in No.43/BBCDEFGISSSV/2025 dated 17.09.2025 and quash the same and direct the respondents to produce the body or person of the detenu by name Palanivel Rajan @ PTR Vinoth, S/o.Nagendiran, aged about 35 years, now detained as Goonda at Central Prison, Madurai, before this Court and set him at liberty forthwith.



ORDER

(Order of the Court was made by the Hon'ble N.Anand Venkatesh J.)



Pursuant to the earlier order passed on 10.03.2026, the learned State Public Prosecutor filed the status report of the Principal Secretary to Government, Home, Prohibition and Excise (XIV) Department.

2. Paragraphs 11 and 12 of the status report set out the particulars relating to the number of petitions filed for cancellation of bail and their pendency. Paragraphs 13 to 16 deal with the introduction of the standard operating procedure to effectively address repeat offenders. For proper appreciation, paragraphs 11 to 16 are extracted hereunder:

11. It is respectfully submitted that, due to the sincere efforts taken by the supervisory officers, there is significant increase in the bail cancellation petitions filed by the Investigation Officers. The figures collected from the unit officers for the period from 01.01.2025 to 31.03.2026 are consolidated and put up for the consideration of this hon'ble court.

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12. It is submitted that, the filing of application for bail cancellation has increased in the year 2025 when compared with previous years. A total of 1654 bail cancellation petitions were filed in the year 2025, of which 488 Petitions were allowed by the court and the bail were cancelled, 546 petitions are pending and 620 petitions were rejected by the court. For the year 2026 (Till 31.03.2026), a total of 297 bail cancellation petitions were filed, of which 90 petitions were allowed by the court and the bail were cancelled, 153 petitions are pending and 54 petitions were rejected by the court.

13. I respectfully submit that, the CCTNS 1.0 application had "Accused Search feature" available on the CCTNS Officer Portal. This facility is accessible to all police stations and senior officers. The search allows investigation officers to get the details of accused persons from the CCTNS database based on inputs such as name, parentage, gender, age, and alias. Further, in the CCTNS 1.0 application, the search functionality for accused individuals is limited to exact name matching, requiring the user to spell the precise spelling of the name. This constraint often hampers effective identification, especially in cases of spelling variations, aliases, or data entry discrepancies.

14. It is respectfully submitted that, the CCTNS 2.0 which was rolled out on 26.02.2026 has phonetic name search capability, allowing users to retrieve results based on sound-alike names. This will be complemented by additional filtering parameters such as age, gender, Physical descriptors (e.g., height, complexion and identifiable marks, Mobile number, Unique Government-issued Identifiers (e.g., Aadhaar number, Driving License number,


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Voter ID, etc.). Upon entering any unique identifier(e.g., mobile number, Aadhaar number, etc.), the system will automatically alert the Investigation Officer, if the accused has a record of previous crimes. The alert will include details such as District, Police Station and Crime Number(s).

15. I respectfully submit that, under CCTNS 2.0, if the permanent address of the arrested accused belongs to another district, the details of the arrested person in the format of the "Arrested Person Register -Proforma shall be communicated to the designated officer of the concerned district via their official email ID. The system will auto-generate the Arrested Person Register with the following fields "Sl.No., District, Sub Division, Police Station, Crime Number, Act-Section of Law, Case Type - Sub Case Type, Date of Report, Name of the Accused and Address, Date and Time of Arrest, Place of Arrest, Action Taken After Arrest, Stage of the Case, Photograph, Detail Proforma as per section 37 (b) of BNSS". Also provisions are made available in the system for the supervisory officers to view the Arrested Person details in the format of the "Arrested Person Register" based on their jurisdiction.

16. It is respectfully submitted that, under CCTNS 2.0, if any FIR is registered against the history sheeted accused in any police station, the notification will be sent to the SHO who created the history sheet and they can accept/reject to add those new case details to the history sheet.

3. On a careful consideration of the status report, it is seen that, in the year 2025, although 1654 petitions for cancellation of bail were filed, as many as 546 petitions remain pending. Similarly, in the year 2026, 297 petitions for cancellation of bail have been filed, out of which 153 petitions are pending.



4. This Court is inclined to obtain further particulars regarding the pendency of such petitions before the various Courts. Hence, there shall be a direction to the first respondent to furnish a detailed break-up of the pendency of cancellation of bail petitions, so as to enable this Court to issue appropriate directions.
