N.S.Shekhawat J. (Oral)

1. After arguing at length, learned counsel for the petitioner wishes to withdraw the present petition with liberty to raise all the pleas available to him. before the Trial Court, at an appropriate stage.
2. Dismissed as withdrawn, with liberty aforesaid.
3. Since, the petitioner is stated to be a disabled person, he is at liberty to move an application for grant of exemption from personal appearance and the Trial Court shall consider the same sympathetically.
4. In the event of allowing such application, the Trial Court would be at liberty to impose any condition, as may be deemed fit and appropriate and may also insist for the presence of petitioner before the Trial Court on any date of hearing.

5. Since, the F.I.R in the present case was registered on 15.01.2022, Trial Court is directed to expedite the trial and to conclude the same at the earliest, preferably within a period of two and half years from the date of receipt of certified copy of this order.
6. Pending application(s), if any, stand(s), disposed of, accordingly.
