MAIN CASE

The petitioners-plaintiffs, by way of present revision petition,
seek issuance of directions to the learned Civil Judge, Junior Division,
Chandigarh for expeditious disposal of *Civil Suit No. 1041 of 2021*, titled
“Col. Harkirat Singh and another Versus Monia Singh and another”,
which has been ordered to be heard alongwith *Civil Suit No. 1957 of 2019*,
titled *“Bhopinder Kaur Versus Harkirat Singh”*, vide order dated
12.07.2024 (Annexure P-1) passed by this Court in Civil Revision No. 3506
of 2023.

[2] Learned counsel for the petitioners, *inter alia*, contends that
despite consent given by the petitioners for consolidation of the aforesaid

two civil suits for proper adjudication and despite a detailed order having been passed by this Court on 12.07.2024 in Civil Revision No. 3506 of 2023; and Civil Revision No. 24 of 2024 (both filed by respondent No. 1/defendant No. 1-Monia Singh), the aforesaid suits are still pending adjudication as yet; thus, prays for disposal of the same at the earliest.

[3] I have heard learned counsel for the petitioners and gone through the paper-book.

[4] Considering the fact that both the civil suits i.e. (i) Civil Suit No. 1957 of 2019; and (ii) Civil Suit No. 1041 of 2021 were ordered to be clubbed together vide order dated 12.07.2024 passed by this Court and are pending adjudication by the trial Court for the past more than five years. In such circumstances, without commenting on the merits of the controversy and keeping in view the limited prayer made on behalf of the petitioners, purely in the interest of justice, the learned trial Court is requested to decide the aforesaid suits as expeditiously as possible, preferably within a period of one year from the next date fixed, i.e. 20.04.2026.

[5] **Disposed of** accordingly.

[6] Keeping in view the nature of proceedings, the present petition is being decided without issuing notice to the respondents, lest it may delay the proceedings before the learned trial Court and may also burden them with unnecessary costs towards litigation expenses.
