1. Instant criminal writ petition has been filed under Article 226 of Constitution of India read with Section 528 of BNSS, 2023 for issuance of direction to respondent Nos.1 to 4 to provide protection to the petitioner and his family members at the hands of respondent Nos.5 to 8.

2. Learned counsel for the petitioner contended that the petitioner and respondent No.5 are husband and wife, and a matrimonial dispute arose between both of them. Due to the same, private respondents created a nuisance, tried to manhandle the petitioner and openly extended threats to the petitioner and his parents for dire consequences. Moreover, respondent No.5 has illegally occupied the house of the petitioner by way of a coerced compromise. In this regard, the petitioner has moved a representation dated 01.03.2026 (Annexure P-3), but no action has been taken so far.

3. Notice of motion.

4. Mr. Adesh Pal Singh, AAG, Punjab, who is present in the Court, accepted notice on behalf of respondent-State and submitted that in the present



matter, a compromise has already been arrived at between the parties and the petitioner and respondent No.5 have recorded their respective statements in support of compromise.

5. Heard.
6. Keeping in view the contentions of learned counsel for the parties and the fact that the present matter is a matrimonial dispute between husband and wife; upon the complaint/representation moved by the petitioner, both the parties were called to the police station and a compromise has already been arrived between the parties, no further order is called for in the present petition.
7. Disposed of accordingly.
8. If the petitioner is still aggrieved, he is at liberty to take recourse in accordance with law.
