HARKESH MANUJA, J. (ORAL)

The petitioners, by way of present petition, seek issuance of a writ in the nature of *Mandamus*, thereby directing the respondents to pay solatium @ 100% alongwith interest in terms of Section 30 read with Schedule I of The Right to Fair Compensation and Transparency in Land Acquisition, Rehabilitation and Resettlement Act, 2013.

[2] Upon notice, no reply has been filed.

[3] At the outset, learned counsel for the petitioners submits that the present matter is squarely covered by the judgment dated **06.04.2026** passed by this Court in *CWP No. 18620 of 2023* titled as “*Rajinder Singh and anr. Versus National Highway Authority of India and ors.*”

[4] Learned counsel(s) for the respondent(s) are not in a position to controvert the above factual position.

[5] After going through the judgment passed by this Court referred to above as well as the facts of the present case, this Court agrees with the assertion of the learned counsel for the petitioners.

[6] Consequently, the present writ petition is **disposed of** in the same terms as ***Rajinder Singh’s case (supra)***.
