ANOOP CHITKARA, J. (Oral)

1. Learned counsel for the private respondent submits that the matter stands settled between the parties.

2. Learned counsel for the appellant(s) submits that the clients are not responding to him. On this, learned counsel for the private respondent submits that such response itself substantiates his statement that the matter has been settled between the parties. Even otherwise, the appeal had to be transferred to the Sessions Court in view of the judgment in '*M/s Celestium Financial Vs. A. Gnanasekaran Etc. 2025 INSC 804: 2025(3) RCR (Criminal) 208*'

3. Given this background, the leave to appeal is dismissed for



non-prosecution. In case compromise had not taken place, liberty is reserved to file appeal afresh before the Sessions Court by assigning reasons, if the matter is not compromised and by explaining the delay. It is further clarified that the time during which the leave to appeal was remain pending before this Court shall not be counted for the purpose of limitation and the limitation to file appeal would start from today.
