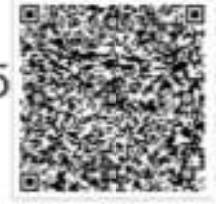

The prayer in this second petition under Section 482 BNSS, 2023 (Section 438 Cr.P.C.) is for the grant of anticipatory bail to the petitioner case FIR No.584 dated 27.12.2024 under Sections 419, 420, 406, 467, 468, 471 IPC (Sections 319(2), 318(4), 316(2), 338, 336(3), 340(2) and 61(1) BNS) and Section 8 of the Prevention of Corruption Act, registered at Police Station Dabua, District Faridabad.

2. The learned counsel for the petitioner contends that now that the report under Section 173(2) Cr.P.C. (Section 193(2) BNSS) stands filed against the arrested accused, the petitioner be granted the concession of anticipatory bail.

3. I have heard the learned counsel for the petitioner.

4. Vide order dated 19.11.2025 (Annexure P-3), a Co-ordinate Bench of this Court had dismissed the first anticipatory bail application of

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the petitioner. Thereafter, the petitioner approached Hon'ble the Supreme Court wherein the following order was passed:-

We dispose of this Special Leave petition by reserving liberty to the petitioner herein to seek regular bail, in case of necessity.

It is needless to observe that if the petitioner makes an application seeking regular bail, the same shall be considered on its own merits, as expeditiously as possible and in accordance with law.

Pending application(s) shall stand disposed of.

5. In view of the fact that a Co-ordinate Bench of this Court has dismissed the first petition for the grant of anticipatory bail on 19.11.2025 and the Hon'ble Supreme Court has also dismissed the Special Leave Petition against the aforesaid order, the question of the grant of anticipatory bail to the petitioner does not arise.

6. In view of the above, the present petition stands dismissed.

7. The pending application(s), if any, shall stand disposed of accordingly.
