JAGMOHAN BANSAL, J. (Oral)

1. The petitioners through instant petition under Article 226 of the Constitution of India are seeking setting aside of notification dated 04.11.2025 whereby respondents have proposed and sanctioned the installation of high-voltage 66 KV electricity poles and overhead wires. They are further seeking direction to respondents not to install any high voltage 66 KV electricity pole or transmission lines on their property. They are also seeking stay on construction of electricity pole as per above mentioned notification.

2. As per petition, the petitioners are owners of land comprised in Khewat No.1159/1145, Khatoni No.1553, Khasra No.193, Killa Nos.9, 11, 16, 23 & 24 and Khasra No.211, Killa No.3/1 situated at Ferozepur City, Tehsil & District Ferozepur. They claim that officials of the respondent-department on 22.12.2025 came to their land along with construction material and labour. They served a legal notice dated 22.12.2025 upon

respondent. They also approached the Court of Civil Judge, (Junior

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Division), Ferozepur by way of Civil Suit for restraining respondents to construct the high voltage electricity poles on their lands. The respondents have issued notification dated 04.11.2025 for installation of high-voltage 66 KV electricity poles and overhead wires. The proposed site included petitioners' land.

3. Learned counsel for the petitioners submits that respondent has neither paid compensation for using petitioners' land nor complied with safety standards.

4. Mr. P.I.P Singh, Advocate appeared and filed his Memorandum of Appearance on behalf of respondent Nos.2 to 6. The same is taken on record. Registry is directed to tag the same at an appropriate place.

5. Learned counsel for respondent Nos.2 to 6 submits that the competent authority would consider petitioners' claim and pay due amount of compensation, in accordance with law in force. There would also be compliance of safety standards.

6. Learned counsel for the petitioners agrees to aforesaid arrangement.

7. In the wake of statement of both sides, the petition stands disposed of.
