1. The instant second petition has been filed under Section 483 of BNSS, 2023 (earlier Section 439 Cr.P.C.), for grant of regular bail to the petitioner, during the pendency of trial, who has been booked in a criminal case arising out of First Information Report, as detailed here-under:-

2. First bail petition filed by the petitioner along with co-accused – Jashanjot Singh, was dismissed as withdrawn vide order dated 11.03.2026 (Annexure P-7), with liberty to file a fresh petition seeking concession of bail after completion of one year of incarceration.

However, present second petition has been filed within a period of about three months from the date of passing of the aforesaid order.



Therefore, no fresh ground or change in circumstances has been pointed out so as to warrant reconsideration of the prayer for bail at this stage.

3. Accordingly, finding no merit in the present petition, **same is dismissed at this stage**, with liberty to the petitioner to file a fresh bail petition after completion of one year period of incarceration inside the jail.
