1. The present petition has been filed under Section 438 of Cr.P.C. (Section 482 of BNSS, 2023) seeking grant of anticipatory bail in case FIR No.63 dated 30.04.2026, registered under Sections 21(b) of the Narcotic Drugs and Psychotropic Substances Act, 1985, at Police Station Baragudha, District Sirsa.
2. The Coordinate Bench of this Court, vide order dated 25.05.2026, had directed the petitioner to appear before the SHO/Investigating Officer and join investigation and in the event of his arrest, he was ordered to be released on interim bail to the satisfaction of the SHO/Investigating Officer, subject to the conditions envisaged under Section 482(2) of the BNSS (erstwhile Section 438(2) Cr.P.C.).
3. Learned counsel for the petitioner submits that in compliance of the order dated 25.05.2026, passed by the Co-ordinate Bench of this Court, the petitioner has joined and cooperated with the investigation.



4. Learned State counsel has filed the status report by way of an affidavit of Rajesh Kumar, HPS, Deputy Superintendent of Police (Sadar) Sirsa District Sirsa in the Court today and the same is taken on record. He further submits that the petitioner has joined the investigation and is not required for further custodial interrogation.

5. In view of the statement made by learned State counsel, the petition is allowed and the interim order dated 25.05.2026 is **made absolute**. The petitioner shall continue to join investigation, as and when called by the Investigating Officer and shall also abide by the conditions as provided under Section 482(2) of the BNSS.

6. However, it is clarified that the investigating authority on addition of an offence or offences may not proceed to arrest the accused/petitioner, but for arresting the accused/petitioner on such addition of offence or offences it needs to obtain an order to arrest the accused/petitioners from the Court which had granted the bail in view of the judgment passed by the Hon'ble Supreme Court in *Sumit Vs State of U.P. and Another*, Criminal Appeal No. 830 of 2026, decided on 09.02.2026.

7. Pending application(s), if any, shall also stand disposed of.
