1. The present petition has been filed under Article 226 of the Constitution of India for issuance of directions to respondents No.2 & 3 to protect the life and liberty of the petitioners and to restrain the private respondents No.4 & 5 not to harass or interfere in the peaceful married life of the petitioners and to protect the life and liberty of petitioners at the hands of private respondents.
2. Learned counsel for the petitioners, *inter alia*, contends that the petitioners are major and claimed to have married each other and they seek protection to their life and liberty as they apprehend danger to their lives at the hands of private respondents. Learned counsel for the petitioners further submits that the representation submitted by the petitioners before the jurisdictional police authorities is pending consideration and has not been decided till date.
3. Notice of motion to the official respondents only.

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4. Mr. Balwan Singh, Advocate puts in appearance on receipt of advance notice on behalf of respondents No.4 & 5 and filed his *vakalatnama* in the Court today which is taken on record. He submits that the private respondents have no intention to harm the petitioners rather they are apprehensive about their welfare.

5. Learned Assistant Advocate General who is present in Court, accepts notice for the official respondents. Learned counsel for the petitioners is directed to supply a copy of complete paper book to learned State counsel during course of the day.

5. Without commenting on validity of the marriage allegedly performed by the petitioners and entering upon an exercise to evaluate the evidentiary value of the documents placed on the file, I dispose of this petition with direction to concerned Senior Superintendent of Police to decide representation of the petitioners within a period of one week from the date of receipt of a certified copy of this order and grant them protection, if there is any threat to their life and liberty. It is made clear that this order shall not be taken to protect the petitioners from legal action for violation of law, if any committed by them.

6. Pending miscellaneous application(s), if any, shall also stands disposed of.
