JAGMOHAN BANSAL, J. (ORAL)

1. The petitioner through instant petition under Articles 226/227 of the Constitution of India is seeking direction to respondent to pay interest on delayed payment of retiral dues.

2. The petitioner retired from Punjab Police as Deputy Superintendent of Police (DSP) on 30.04.2015. He was paid pensionary benefits in March' 2016. He filed representation dated 23.03.2016 claiming interest on delayed payment of retiral dues. His representation was rejected vide order dated 23.06.2016.

3. As per written statement, there was no lapse on the part of respondent. The petitioner filed pension papers at a later stage. He filed his affidavit on 08.07.2015 i.e. after two months from the date of retirement. He was supposed to submit documents at least six months prior to his retirement.

4. There is no representation on behalf of the petitioner. It appears that with the efflux of time, petitioner has lost his interest to

pursue the matter.

5. ***Dismissed*** with liberty to the petitioner to move an appropriate application within six months from today, if cause survives.
6. Pending application(s), if any, shall also stand disposed of.
