3. The present writ petition has been filed under Article 226 and 227 of the Constitution of India, seeking following reliefs:-

- a. Issue a Writ of Certiorari, or any other appropriate writ, order, or direction, quashing the impugned order dated 08.12.2025 passed by the Debt Recovery Tribunal-I, Delhi in Miscellaneous Application No. 74 of 2025 in T.A. No. 1723 of 2022;*
- b. Issue a Writ of Certiorari, or any other appropriate writ, order, or direction, quashing the ex-parte final order dated 15.02.2025 and the consequential Recovery Certificate No. 127/2025 issued in T.A. No. 1723 of 2022;*



c. Issue a Writ of Mandamus, or any other appropriate writ, order, or direction, directing the Debts Recovery Tribunal-I, Delhi to restore the T.A. No. 1723 of 2022 to its original number and decide the same on merits after affording the Petitioners a full opportunity of hearing, leading evidence of the fraud allegations, and cross-examination;

d. Award the costs of this petition in favour of the Petitioners; and/or

4. At the outset, learned counsel for the petitioners seeks leave to withdraw the present writ petition with liberty to file an appropriate petition under Article 227 of the Constitution of India, as the impugned order is passed by a Tribunal.

5. Accordingly, the present writ petition along with pending applications stand disposed of as withdrawn with liberty, as prayed for, in accordance with law.
