1. This petition seems to have been filed in the year 2023 for the following relief:

- “1. Allow the present writ petition and issue a writ in the nature of Mandamus or any other appropriate writ/order and/or direction thereby directing the Respondents to strictly adhere to the timeline and implement the Delhi High Court Rules in letter and spirit.*
- 2. Issue any appropriate writ/order/ or direction thereby directing the Respondent No.2 to supply the certified copies of records as applied for by the Petitioner.*
- 3. Issue any appropriate writ/direction /or order thereby directing the Respondent No.8 to come up with a software system through which litigants / advocates can apply for certified copy of records online.*
- 4. Issue any appropriate writ/ direction/ or order thereby making it mandatory for the respondents to update on the status of application for supply of certified copies to the applicant by way of Short Message Service (SMS).”*



2. With the advent of technology, various steps have been taken by the High Court for speedy supply of certified copies to the lawyers and litigants. If the petitioner is still facing any difficulty, it shall be at liberty to file a representation before the Registrar General. There is no reason as to why the same should not be considered appropriately.
3. If the grievance of the petitioner is not fully mitigated, it shall be at liberty to take appropriate recourse in accordance with law.
4. With these observations, the petition stands disposed of.
