ORDER

1. The present four petitions have been filed assailing orders dated 06.07.2024, 23.07.2024, 26.07.2024 and 02.09.2024, by which bail was granted to four accused persons in FIR No. 338/2024 dated 10.06.2024, registered at Police Station Kalyanpuri, under Sections 307/34 of the Indian Penal Code, 1860.
