1. Mr. Rajesh Gautam, counsel for the Petitioner, submits that the relief sought in the present petition has been rendered infructuous in view of the decision rendered by the Bombay High Court, Aurangabad Bench, in Writ Petition No. 175/2021 titled ***Adarsh Kumar Jain and Ors. vs. UOI & Ors.***
2. He submits that the Department has, in fact, decided to comply with the said decision and has already issued communications in that regard.
