1. *Vide* order dated 17.03.2026 it was recorded as under:-

3. At request of the learned counsel for the petitioner, who seeks an adjournment to produce a bank-draft of Rs.15,00,000/- (being the remaining amount payable in terms of the settlement agreement between the parties as recorded in the order dated 25.10.2025 passed by the Mediation Centre, Saket Courts, New Delhi, in CC No. 4148/2022), re-notify on 07.04.2026.

2. Today, it is informed by the respective counsel for the parties that pursuant to the aforesaid order, a sum of Rs. 7,50,000/- was paid to the respondent no.1 by way of RTGS. Further, a bank draft of Rs. 7,50,000/- payable to the respondent no.1 has been handed over to the learned counsel for the respondents during the course of proceedings.

3. Learned counsel for the respondents submits that the entire amount of Rs. 35,00,000/- as referred to in the Settlement Agreement dated 25.10.2025 has been received by the respondent no. 1. Consequently, it is stated that in view thereof, the respondents shall act in accordance with the stipulation contained in Clause-5 of the aforesaid Settlement Agreement and shall withdraw the pending cases referred therein. The said clause reads as under:-



5. It is further agreed that on receipt of the entire settled payment, the First Party shall withdraw the present complaint case and also get the two cases <sup>withdrawn</sup> filed before the Court of Ld. JMFC at Gurgaon District detailed herein-below :-

- (i) NACT No.17596/2022, titled "Rahul Mittal Vs. Hemant Bhagat & Ors."
- (ii) NACT No.17601/2022, titled "Rahul Mittal Vs. Hemant Bhagat & Ors."

4. Binding the respondents to the aforesaid undertaking, the present petition is disposed of.

5. In case, any of the parties have any outstanding grievance, they shall be at liberty to avail appropriate legal remedies under law.
