ORDER

02.04.2026

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1. By virtue of the present petition under *Section 528* of the Bharatiya Nagarik Suraksha Sanhita, 2023 (**BNSS**), the petitioners seek quashing of FIR No.0084/2025 dated 24.07.2025 registered at PS.: Barakhamba Road, Delhi under *Sections 109(1)/140(3)/62/3(5)* of the Bharatiya Nyaya Sanhita, 2023 (**BNS**) and all proceedings emanating therefrom, in view of the Settlement Agreement dated 24.03.2026 [**Annexure P3**] arrived between the petitioners and the respondent no.2, which is accompanied by their respective proofs of identities.
2. Issue notice. Learned APP for the State accepts notice and submits that he has no objection to the quashing of the aforesaid FIR.



3. Respondent no.2, present in Court, also accepts notice and submits that he has no objection to the quashing of the aforesaid FIR in view of the Settlement Agreement dated 24.03.2026.

4. The petitioners and the respondent no.2, present in Court, as well as their credentials, as on record, have been identified by the Investigating Officer.

5. Facts disclose that a settlement has already been arrived voluntarily between the petitioners and the respondent no.2 as also the present petition is accompanied by their respective affidavit(s) to the said effect. In view thereof, they shall remain bound by all the terms and conditions of the settlement arrived *inter se* themselves. As such, following the law laid down by the Hon'ble Supreme Court in ***Jitendra Raghuvanshi & Ors. vs. Babita Raguvanshi & Anr.***: (2013) 4 SCC 58, ***Gian Singh vs. State of Punjab & Anr.***: (2012) 10 SCC 303 and ***Narinder Singh & Ors. vs. State of Punjab & Anr.***: (2014) 6 SCC 466, since there is nothing left to corroborate and prove the case of the prosecution, continuation of the aforesaid FIR against the petitioners will be an exercise in futility.

6. Accordingly, the present petition is allowed and FIR No.0084/2025 dated 24.07.2025 registered at PS.: Barakhamba Road, Delhi under Sections 109(1)/140(3)/62/3(5) of the BNS and all proceedings emanating therefrom are hereby quashed.

7. As such, the present petition, alongwith pending application, is disposed of in the aforesaid terms.
